Walking with llamas on East Devon's spectacular Jurassic Coast certainly adds a twist to a weekend stroll.

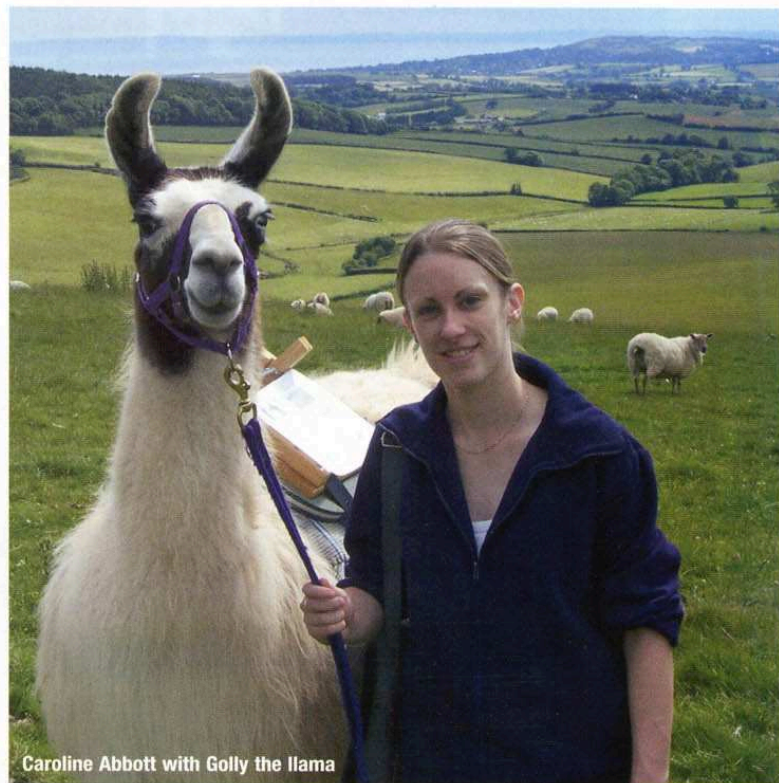
The activity is sometimes known as llama trekking but this can mislead people into thinking they can ride the llamas.
