OUT ON the trail with llamas must be a first for Trefoil Guild members.

A group of six, led by chairman June Usherwood, enjoyed a walk over Peak Hill on Wednesday with llamas Golly and Ben.

"This is all part of the fun of being in Trefoil," said Catherine Battell, 63, as she led Golly on the walk, which is part of a county-wide challenge to Trefoil Guilds to make 'trails' to cover the region.

"Even when you are older, you can still do things that are different and fun," said Mrs Battell, who has been in guiding for more than 50 years.

Trails are being made by walking, riding a horse, bicycle, car or battery car.

Starting in Cornwall, one covers the north coast up to Somerset and the other south, through Devon to Dorset.

On Tuesday, members of the Sidmouth Trefoil Guild walked from Salcombe Hill to Port Royal, handing over to a less-abled team,

who walked along the seafront to Peak Hill.

On Wednesday the group carried on with the llamas, led by Maggie Jee of Peak Hill Llamas.

Mrs Usherwood said: "We hope we are the only group in the region to go walking with llamas."

Money raised by the 24 Devon guilds will go to Devon Air Ambulance Trust to support its work.
